

Health Care

Ukrainians have been granted emergency approval to come to Canada. This means they have access to health care supports and services. In Ontario, it is the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) that covers this.

Apply for a Health Card

You must apply for OHIP in person at a ServiceOntario centre. There is no waiting period and you can apply for coverage as soon as you arrive in Ontario. For more information, call the ServiceOntario INFOline at **1-866-532-3161** (toll-free).

Prescriptions
